

CARSON CITY NEVADA Consolidated Municipality and State Capital PUBLIC WORKS

On March 5, 2020, the Carson City Board of Supervisors initiated the process of increasing the user rates for Water and Wastewater services. Enclosed for your review is a copy of the Water and Wastewater Rate Studies that were presented to the Board of Supervisors on March 5, 2020, by Farr West Engineering. The Board of Supervisors directed staff to proceed with a proposed 5-year rate increase for the water and wastewater funds beginning on July 1, 2020; due to the Covid-19 pandemic the initial increase has been delayed until January 1, 2021. The following table summarizes the proposed percentage rate increase.

On August 6, 2020 the Carson City Board of Supervisors initiated the process of increasing the user rates for Stormwater service. Enclosed for your review is a copy of the Stormwater Rate Study that was presented to the Board of Supervisors on August 6, 2020, by Farr West Engineering. The Board of Supervisors directed staff to proceed with a proposed new user rate structure based on amount of impervious area of all non-Single Family Residential parcels and a 4-year user rate increase for the stormwater fund. The following tables summarize the proposed stormwater user rate structure and implementation time frame. Please note that there are two proposed structures for the Board of Supervisors to consider. One that has a flat rate for the single family residential properties, and one that has a tiered rate structure based on the residence's square footage. The Grouped Impervious Area Rates for other properties are the same in both proposals.

Staff Summary: On February 7, 2019, the Board of Supervisors approved a contract with Farr West Engineering to prepare a water and wastewater rate refresh study of the water and wastewater rates. The objective of the study was to review the financial position of the respective funds; incorporate current and projected operating, maintenance, and capital improvement plan costs; and to determine revenue requirements to meet the projected expense requirements. Farr West Engineering will present the results and recommendations of the study. Upon approval from the Board of Supervisors, staff would initiate the process to change water and wastewater rates, which includes the preparation

of a business impact statement and revisions to the Carson City Municipal Code to

effectuate the rates.

Previous Action

On February 7, 2019, the Board of Supervisors approved a contract with Farr West Engineering to prepare a refresh update of the water and wastewater rates. On January 13, 2020, the Utility Finance Oversight Committee was presented with the results and recommendations of the study. The Committee recommended proceeding to the Board of Supervisors with the results and recommendations.

Background/Issues & Analysis

Carson City undertook a comprehensive rate study in 2013 for the water and wastewater utilities which resulted in significant changes to the rate structures, customer class allocations and a 5-year rate increase program. This previous rate increase program concluded with final increases occurring July 1, 2017. In 2019, Farr West Engineering was awarded a contract to update the rate models created in the 2013 rate study effort. Farr West Engineering is an expert in conducting utility rate studies and provides these services to multiple clients in the region. The update study includes reviewing and analyzing current rate and customer class data, operational and maintenance costs, projected Capital Improvement Plan (CIP) expenditures, projected rate of increases for

the various cost and growth categories, and current policy objectives to update the City's current rate model and provide rate recommendations for the upcoming 5-year period. Farr West Engineering recommends increasing water rates by 3% per year, and increasing wastewater rates by 3.5% per year, beginning in FY 2021 and continuing through FY 2025.
